MY NBC STORY

Each year we try to have a unique story or article for our annual report, last year was from Dave Malthouse after the naming of Malthouse Field. Following his speech at Senior Presentation about his love of the club and what NBC history means to him, several people commented that should be written down, so here is Ben Portell Snr's NBC Story, written by his son Ben Portelli Jnr.

I was talking about the club with my dad, Ben Portelli Snr, after Presentation Night. He mentioned that he was amazed at the continued growth of the club, and all the new faces that have stepped up to volunteer their time and help. At the same time, he expressed concern that some of the old legends, the old stories are fading away as time marches on. To many they are just names on the honour board, or a perpetual trophy. So I decided to sit down with him so we could document those stories, and bring the names to life.

Here's his story...

When and how did you join NBC?

We emigrated to Australia from Malta in 1956. After spending some time in a migrant camp in regional Victoria we moved into our first house in Douglas Pde, Newport (directly across the road from the old coal power plant) in the late 1950's.

My dad used to make me go to church on Sunday mornings, but I would skip church and go to Digman Reserve to kick the footy and muck around with my mates. It was a cold Sunday morning in Winter 1960, I was 10 years old, and I headed down to Digman (instead of church) and I saw a group of kids throwing a baseball around, I didn't know what it was so I went over and started watching them.

I remember a bloke came over to me and asked me if I wanted a throw and catch. I said, "why not?" and joined in. I later found out the bloke's name, it was Stan McKay – a club legend. He gave me his glove and told me to go out and catch the ball, and that's how it all started. I was hooked, we played every Sunday mornings over the winter.

Dad still made me go to church - on a Saturday night, because I played baseball on Sunday. I didn't get out of that.

What's been your greatest highlight?

U14 Premiership, 1963 vs Hartwell. It was the club's first junior premiership. Stan MacKay and Jack Bunting were our coaches. We had 2 kids who went on to win the Mackrell in that team - Harry Bunting & Keith Quinn.

The club is putting on a dinner for your all-time favourite 9 Rams (living or dead, players or volunteers). Who are the other 8 people you'd invite?

- 1. Reg Simpson. I always enjoyed his company. Someone I learned a lot from, and just a really good human
- 2. Jack Bunting. He was my mentor and my sports dad. My father didn't understand Australian culture or sport, so Jack picked up those pieces and really looked after me
- 3. John Armstrong. A very knowledgeable and loyal friend. We won a premiership together in 1977
- 4. Dick Murdoch. He was my first senior coach when I graduated from juniors. He was the 3rds coach, and his priority was to push kids up through 3rds to the 1's & 2's. He always looked out for us
- 5. Beryl Bunting. Beryl was my 2nd mum. She looked after me when mum couldn't
- 6. Billy Thom. An amazing man. We were playing a game at Myers Flats (Essendon) one stinking hot day. Billy was coaching 3rd base (despite the fact he was in the final stages of a bowel cancer fight he would sadly, ultimately lose). As I slid into 3rd I got kneed in stomach and was in a fair bit of pain. I don't know what happened next, but all I heard was the word "Wog!" and a fight broke out. Despite the fact he was wearing a colostomy bag, Billy jumped in boots and all in and threw punches to defend his mate. He didn't care about his own welfare; he was sticking up for his mate. I'd love to be able to repay him and say thanks
- 7. John Merriman. Another great friend, and coach of the 3rds Premiership team I was part of. When I was a kid, we never had much money. My most prized possession, my bat, was broken and we didn't have the money to replace it. John found out and he gave me one. I still don't know to this day whether he made it himself or whether it was courtesy of the famous (infamous) Willy Dockyards.
- 8. Shane Comben. Combo. One of the most loyal, passionate people you'd ever meet. I've known him since he was 13 and he's always been great company. Plus, I'd never hear the end of it if he wasn't invited!

I'd also find a way to sneak my two great mates Sid Bunting and Ian Middlemass into the dinner. Both lifelong friends. I love them dearly.

What has been the achievement you're most proud of?

Receiving a Currie and a Life Membership for doing something I love, and then seeing you also be awarded a Life Membership and then taking on the role of Club President. Gave me immense pride.

What's your favourite Rams story? Why?

Most of them are unprintable – we are a family club after all!! The ones that come to mind are the fundraisers of the past that just wouldn't be acceptable today. That's all I'll say...

Another is the celebrations for our B Grade Premiership, under Ron McIvor in 1974 (made even sweeter because we beat Willy). Looking back, whoever won that game was set for sustained success. We went on from strength to strength after that and won our first A grade premiership 2 years later.

Who is the biggest character you ever met at club?

Alf Herring – just a funny, kind, jovial, man. Used to score for the 3rds. Always had a smile on his face. He was a legend. The story goes that he was at Dodger Stadium one sunny afternoon in the mid-1970's. As he often did, he got chatting to the bloke next to him, a local fella from LA. His new mate was surprised that an Aussie would know so much about America's pastime and asked him how he knew so much. Alf proudly told him of his involvement with the Newport Rams. "Where's that?" asked Alf's new mate. Without missing a beat, Alf replied "Behind Willy Cemetery..."

You've done it all – player, coach, committee member, handyman. What's given you the most joy or satisfaction over the journey?

Playing in my younger years. Definitely. I wish I could play one more game.

Now, it's seeing the club grow and succeed. I get great joy out of seeing the young kids I coached turn into fine men and leaders of the club – you, Trent, Landy, Aspy, Chad, Dean Marnell and many others. We're in good hands.

Also, and most importantly, working/arguing with Combo brings me great joy.

And lastly, what's your #Why?

From day one, what the club gave me as a kid, and the enjoyment, to be accepted as a new Australian gave me a lot of things in my youth that I hope I have paid back. I'll be a Ram until the day I die. Watching my sons play and now watching my Grandsons play is my ultimate #why.

Thanks for your time dad. I've loved hearing this. Thanks for sharing.

Thanks for letting me share mate. It's been fun reminiscing and it's made me a bit emotional, I got goosebumps for a bit there.

It was good to see strong player numbers throughout the season. The 4ths had 9 players play at least 10 of the 14 games and another 3 who played 6 games which gave us 12 core players for the season.

The 4ths had a good season and tied with Port Melbourne for 4th with 8 wins, 5 losses and 1 draw. The first tie breaker is the head-to-head, in our only game with Port we had a 6-6 draw, the next tie breaker is runs allowed to the top team. We missed the 4 because we let the top team score a couple more runs than Port, so narrowly missed finals by a couple runs.

This year the 4ths did not have a scorer, so thank you to the opposition scorers who let me take a photo of their scorebook, which I copied into ours, so I could produce the seasons stats.

One season highlight occurred in our last innings before Christmas against Werribee where we scored 20 runs. Then in the first innings after Christmas against Preston we scored 19 runs. That's 39 runs in 2 consecutive innings. Over those 2 games Atticus Hurford went 6 from 8, 2 x BB, 9 runs and 5 RBIs.

I created a couple of special achievement awards, which do not come with a trophy just the Honour and Glory.

The first award is the Golden Arm Award, won by Peter Fraczek. I am sure Peter is well versed in the etiquette of cricket, but not so much in baseball yet. While playing Centerfield at Werribee, Peter fielded a ball on the hop, noticing the batter was lollygagging down the line, so Peter launched a throw to first which Sam Aldenhoven ably scooped up on the half volley and the batter was out by a step, grounded out to centerfield.

Though not unlike a young Nolan Ryan, there were a couple of hits, walks, errors and runs and one of the batters reached on a dropped 3rd strike. But she still got the strikeouts when needed.

The Official Awards included: Best Team Player was won by Peter Fraczek: This was Peter's first season of baseball after playing way too many years of Cricket. Like most cricketers, he started out well, but then fell into the trap of over thinking what he was doing. He improved when he just played his natural game. In the last half of the season, he had 2 games with 5 runs batted in and one of those was against the top team. Peter ended up leading the team in RBIs with 20. After moving to centerfield Peter excelled taking several diving catches and showing of his strong arm. Peter was not afraid to take a walk or get hit, he led the team with 4 HPB and had an OBP of .578.

Runner up MVP and Best Defensive Player was won by Atticus Hurford: Atticus was our best defensive player, doing a fantastic job catching 12 of our 14 games. Including catching 3 base runners stealing which is a good effort in the 4ths. Atticus got better with the bat as the season progressed and ended up 2nd in the batting averages with 0.459 and he had the most runs scored (25) and most stolen bases (9). Atticus also doubled up and played 5 games in the 3rds at the end of the season.
